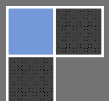

When PRERNA was started four year back (during 2006) to address the issues of underprivileged group of people, especially women and children through better aids, we were worked with limited source of funds. Moreover, Children day care centre at Okhla, old age people day care centre at Gautam Nagar were started with care of PRERNA. PRERNA also organized health camps, HIV/AIDS awareness, family counseling centre, celebration of various special days like children's day function and all other type of religious festival etc.

With sincere thanks to all donors, volunteers, staff, board members and supporters of PRERNA, I am submitting the Annual Report for the year 2010-2011 for your kind information.



Introduction

PRERNA Social Development and Welfare Society is a Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) registered under Societies Registration Act – XXI of 1860. PRERNA is a non-profit voluntary organization, engaged in social activities. Our main objective is to improve the quality of life of the underprivileged and marginalized people. We are determined to replace their despair with hope, their fear with security, and their ignorance with knowledge. The activity has been diversified in the field of non-formal education, formal school education and income generating livelihood skills, Self Help Group (SHG) formation, community health and awareness programs on various social issues. PRERNA is keenly working for the underprivileged group of people especially women and children as well as homeless community.

Vision

“Creating a human friendly society in which every individual can be self dependent and can make their life prestigious”.

Mission

“To provide better opportunities and alternatives for up-liftment of underprivileged group especially women and children through better aids”.

The activities of PRERNA are mainly classified as under:-

- i) Providing regular Non Formal Education (NFE), Formal Education (FE), Vocational trainings like learning of computer, driving, cutting & tailoring, cooking, beautician and Mobile Repairing Course courses etc.
- ii) Running Children day care centers, old age day care centre, family counseling centre and tuition centers.
- iii) Organizing camps on health, HIV/AIDS awareness, family counseling and celebration of various festivals like children's day function, all type of religious festival functions.
- iv) General Projects related to underprivileged group of people like organizing self help group and recreational activities.
- v) Government related/aided projects.

The details of activities under each category have been given separately.

Need of the hour- a brief background on the need of assistance for future development

Only education ensures the **enjoyment of childhood** and also provides various positive ways/options for future of every individual. **Vocational training** is the **backbone for each and every one to earn money** for the day to day livelihood requirements. Under privileged children are the vulnerable target group and very easy prey for a lot of exploitation, harassment in the hands of their employers, local goons general public and police. A survey revealed the situation of children in India that large numbers of children are discontinued their studies in their early age and are mainly engaged in various activities like – **begging, vending, rickshaw pulling, casual labour and rag picking etc.,**. They have a lot of chance to use the drugs or help **drug smuggling/selling, alcohol etc.,** and consequently, they develop **low self esteem, lack of confidence** which may further lead them into **bad habits** like stealing, drug abuse etc.

Police has a major role in controlling law and order situation everywhere and has direct contact with the under privilege children always. A policeman can help/protect a child who is vulnerable to all kinds of exploitations. Therefore, it becomes utmost importance that humanitarian approach of police is essential to protect these children and to keep the law and order of the land. We all know that children are the future of any county.

To prevent this from initial stage, PRERNA is successfully delivering its services for the **last four years** by conducting various such Vocational Trainings, providing good education, morale support, empowerment & making self-reliant and independent by conducting various issue based capacity building workshops as well as assistance to the underprivileged children and their parents. By providing a proper guidance/motivation to the children for their education we are bringing them as a good citizens with sincerity to do good work with social responsibility. At the same time their parents are also learning some other working skills to earn money to fulfill their basic needs i.e. food, clothing, shelter etc.

If, we are not able to provide these basic initial opportunity, these children will have a lot of vulnerable chances to start petty theft, pick pocketing, helping to drug smuggling & smack sellers/ smugglers, etc and automatically spoil their life and becomes as a **'anti-social element'** for the society/Govt. Prerna is continuously contributing its efforts to use and bring out the talent & energy of these children through a channelize way.

Still there is a category is existing in the form of **street children** and **working children** who are selling magazines at the traffic signals, newspapers/refilled water bottles at Railway station, work as casual laborers in small parties & functions etc (the list is very long). A lot of efforts are being taken to bring changes in the life of these children, **but still there is a need of lot of improvement especially in the area of Vocational Training.** The regular and continuous interactions/discussions with such children, PRERNA team understood the urgent need to address these issues at various trades/levels by providing vocational training as per the modern Market Demands.

Empowerment of parents of these children has always been the **top priority** behind all the program of our organization. By empowering the parents, we successfully able to cope up with their difficulties in a better way and maintain their dignity in the community. With these objectives in mind the following types of programs were organized during the financial year 2010-2011.

Activities Conducted by PRERNA

1. Non Formal Education (NFE)

Non-formal primary education and literacy programs

We all know that Education is the most important part for development of every child. **But most of the children in India are not completing the basic primary education programs due to lack of accessibility, awareness, interest in education and due to poverty of their parents.** To induce these children PRERNA took a lot of efforts through its volunteers by conducting continuous counseling of these children as well as their parents and motivated them to continue the study and finally make them admitted in NFE centers. The children with whom we are associated are from non school going background and it is very difficult for them to attend classes in formal school system which is provided by the government and private schools in capital of India. There is a need to run such Non Formal Education program centers which suited for these children and satisfied their needs and is convenient to their timings as well.

PRERNA is running Seven centers by providing non-formal education based on SCERT in the administrate part of the capital, Delhi namely Bhati Mines, Rajpur Khurd, Gautam Puri, Dayal Singh Colony, Okhla, Yusuf Sarai and Safdarjung fly over. At present there are about more than 650 children in the contact area of activity. The uniqueness of these areas is that the availability of only Government school which running with minimum facilities. The so-called private schools are out of reach for these children. Most of the children are engaged in domestic works.

During the financial year 2010-2011 PRERNA provided non-formal education to more than 300 children through the centers in seven contact points. Out of this 60% of them were girls. We were running non-formal centers at South Delhi where there were more than 5000 children present and only one Government school in that area. Prerna is focusing especially on '**girl child education**' for making them as a successful home maker of the future.



Non Formal Education Point

To enable people to move out of their underprivileged status, we created opportunities for them to educate themselves. Poverty and backwardness was reduced only by education. The level of illiteracy is still high and it will remain in that dismal state unless the civil society makes sincere efforts for making more people literate. The government is the major service provider for the educational services to the poor. We have set up education centers where our targeted groups are living. Educating the poor and the underprivileged to overcome the issues and get successful in life. In order to

make this successful sustainable government project Prerna is working on the poor people regularly.

Adult Education



Adult education in India has been a long history and it was organized during the pre-independence period. Through our Adult Education programs we tried to identify the barriers in the development and taught few adult learners residing in slum/clusters. Eagerly they learned the basic education which they had missed during their childhood/teenage. Many of our adult students are very enthusiastic to learn. It helps them to understand the vocational training effectively.

2. Children Admission in School for Formal Education

Education plays most important role of human development and personal empowerment. An essential thread of social cohesion, a good education and firm beliefs in one's power to effect change can overcome poverty and inequality. However, millions of young people around the world do not complete their primary schooling and many more suffer in poor learning environment with little support or encouragement from elders. Without knowing the basic life-skills training or information on livelihood opportunities, sexual and reproductive health and how to navigate the difficult years in between adolescence to adulthood, many young people struggle to improve their lives.

This year PRERNA helped many young children to find their path towards school. In total 253 students were admitted in different government schools. We started this campaign of admitting slum children into government schools on 10th of June 2010. 86 girls and 51 boys in total of 137 children were admitted in formal schools in different locations like Safdarjung, Okhla market, Bhati mines etc. These students are mainly of classes 1st to 7th. PRERNA has also orchestrated the registration of 116 children into NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF OPEN SCHOOLING which includes 68 girls and 48 boys of classes 10th & 12th. These primary schooling student are hoping to enter 10th & 12th standards and do not have the resources to complete the applications on their own. PRERNA offers internet registration assistance and completes the bulk the forms for the student.

The main focus of this well-defined admission program is on the mainstreaming the drop out children into formal schools. Every year in the months of July and August, hundreds of children are enrolled into government/formal schools for primary education centers in classes ranging from 1st to 7th by Prerna. **Working youths and street children were assisted free of charge for their entrance**



and registration in open schooling. Many of these Working youths and street children have passed 10th standard and have a strong desire to continue their education.

3. Sponsorship from the Godparents Foundation

God Parents Foundation is a funding organization. This year God Parents Foundation sponsored 18 school going children. With the help of this funding these children remain in an advantage and utilized this opportunity with excellence. All these children belong from below poverty line and from homeless community. They were enrolled in different classes in government school. These students were provided with tuition fee, educational material, school fee and school uniform under the funds of Gods Parents Foundation.

4. Children Day Care Centre

Prerna started a day care centre at Ohkla from 1st April 2010 to save the childhood of children residing under the flyover. This Ohkla flyover is in between New Friends Colony and Ohkla Railway Station. Children from Bihar, Uttar Pradesh, and Rajasthan are living here with their parents. Most of the parents of these children are involved in daily wages work and some of them are engaged in different types of begging like Bander Nachana etc. Many of these children are involved in begging in the nearby areas of New Friends Colony and Kalka Ji temple which is near to Ohkla flyover. As these children have no means of education, it is very difficult to create their interest on education. As education is a



process of instrument which aimed at all round development of an individual and it is also a mean to enhance a child's knowledge. Most of these children are breadwinner of their families so they cannot spend their precious time on education. Keeping this in mind we have special timings for the kids to teach. At present 42 children are grasping their education through this centre. For making

studies interesting and a fun to learn, PRERNA organizes different types of activities like indoor and outdoor games, different types of workshops and thematic expose visits. With the help of this day care centre PRERNA makes the ADHAAR cards for the underprivileged which are introduced by Delhi Govt. We have also initiated in making the UID cards of these children and their family members.

5. Old Age Day Care Centre

The days of special bonding between grandparents and grand children are fading fast and the decline of the traditional ways of supporting the elderly is steadily going down with both working parents and meeting the demands of consumer driving society and children are mostly preoccupied with T.V, internet and also

academics and peer pressure. Old people within the family often find themselves unwanted and a burden. PRERNA DAY CARE CENTER for elderly people established on 23rd February 2007 at community hall in Gautam Nagar, New Delhi and is going on regularly. PRERNA reached the elderly people and assisted them for getting financial help (old age, widows, and divorcee pension), health related issues, entertainment, reading and for emotional security. Medical checkup camps twice a month were being conducted for routine health related issues. Medicines for free of cost were also provided to the members.

Every Tuesday approx. 25 to 35 elderly people get together at 11:00 am to 1:30 pm and plays games, antakashree, bhajan, and share their experiences with each other.



PRERNA provides facilities of indoor games and fair number of reading material to make them engage apart from giving a common platform to discuss different facet of life and their experiences. The centre provides number of games such as chess, chopad, carom board and playing cards. Library of our centre contain a bulk of religious books and books related to various diseases which are common in old age. Apart from books, magazines and three daily newspapers are also provided to the members. Basic computer training is also provided to the elderly.

6. Family Counseling Centre

In the Indian culture every individual has the unique family relationship and treat this as a most important part of life. Now-a-days, a lot of day to day issues/problems in a family arise due to the modernization of society and improper matching of thinking attitudes and ideas. A Family Counseling Centre is run by PRERNA for solving such types of mismatch of ideas in a family which make the couple understand the root cause of issue/problem. The most important reason behind the **conflict in a family is due to illiteracy and money matters**. If members of the family are illiterate then, it leads to orthodox beliefs and narrow minded thinking which apparently leads to a conflict in a family. In the same way money also plays a vital role for a conflict in a family. Many families face serious financial problems which further leads to tension then a conflict. All these conflicts and problems needs counseling for a smooth family. PRERNA took an initiative of starting a Family Counseling Centre with expert relation counselors which helped many people to achieve peace and prosperity in their own families. This year more than 50 families were benefited through Family Counseling Centre.

7. Vocational Training

Vocational training is the backbone for each and every one to earn for day to day livelihood. Vocational training for youth is an integral part of social work that we have been doing from the starting. We have now succeeded in strengthening our activities in this field. This is particularly relevant in the context of children/youth who don't have the opportunity to complete their education



or learn a useful skill for making them profitably self employed and able to stand on their own feet. We are conducting Vocational training programs covering a broad range of subjects from computer training, cutting and tailoring, embroidery, cooking, painting, mobile repair, electrical, greeting card making, candle making and Driving through Maruti Driving School, Delhi etc.

According to a rough estimate made by different organizations and studies, there are 5 lakh children who are working in Delhi who comprise 18% of the child population of the Union Territory. Presently, there is no study was conducted on the vocationally trained children. On guess estimates, status of placing trained children in trade is quite dismal. There is a need for market driven vocational training programs and viable placements for these children. That's why Vocational Training component becomes an important factor in building confidence in these children to lead a meaningful life in future. We see young children and adult persons on the streets selling magazines at traffic signals, selling newspaper/ refilled water bottles at Railway Station, working as casual laborer in small parties & functions (the list is long). PRERNA has been organizing programs in the field of education, health, recreation and vocational training.



A majority of street children are working for their survival fighting. Almost half of the working street children are self employed such as rag pickers, hawkers, magazines sellers & other vendors across the roads and shoeshine boys. Almost one third of the street children are working in shops and other establishments. One in every three children is working for 10 to 12 hours a day, while one child in ten

has to work for 13 hours a day. This scenario clearly tells that it is not easy to survive on streets. The danger ranging from hazardous working conditions, harassments, and brutality of the employers, road accidents, sexual abuse and easy target for the drug gangs/ smugglers. The life of a street girl although is not as difficult as of a boy, but she is more vulnerable than a boy because of her gender, her life on the street is more exploitative and oppressive than that of a boy.

Livelihood is the most concerned area for the slum dwellers. While men are out for work, women are still on the lookout for it. They don't prefer to go out for long hours and also involves high commuting costs. Thus, efforts are directed to impart skills that would enable them to work from home. PRERNA has been conducting vocational training in different trades. This year we continued to expand the number of available training options. Vocational trainings are organized for youths, who are living under Ohkla, Bhati Mines, Rajpur, Guatam Puri and Sufdarjung fly over. We offer them classes in cutting, tailoring, computer training, embroidery, cooking, painting, greeting card making, Maruti Driving School is supporting to offer drivers training to those who are underprivileged and interested. This year 19 adults received driver's training by this institute which changed their life completely. We can proudly say that this year a total of 183 children have received vocational training through our organization which consists of 106 girls and 77 boys. PRERNA is providing Vocational training throughout the year.

8. Religious and social activities celebration:



PRERNA celebrated all major festivals like Republic day, Independence Day, Diwali, Holi, Id, and Raksha Bandhan with spending these days with Slum/homeless children. Different activities were organized according to festivals celebrated. Various religious activities were also conducted in the centre based on the belief and customs followed by the local people. The members celebrated Republic day, Independence Day, Senior Citizens Day, festivals like Rakshabandhan,

Diwali & Holi and other programs for their entertainment. They also took keen interest in social and political issues.

Sweets, juices and gifts were always distributed on each festival. Dance and Music competition were organized for the children to make them happy and enjoy the festival with lots of excitement and fun.

9. Health camp

Health is wealth, but it does not matter to those who hardly make their both ends meet. Those people, who live without food and shelter, do not give much priority to health problems. They shriek but no one listens to them or their cries. Their unchecked prolonged illness mostly proves fatal. They only dream of visiting a doctor, they cannot afford to live a healthy life. Their lives are so miserable; poverty has recklessly ruined happiness of their lives. We conducted health camps in clusters, homeless communities with help of highly Qualified Medical team. During these health camps, we provided medical treatment and medicines on the spot free of cost for more than 2365 people who were benefited. We also extended care through hospitalization of patients with serious nature of diseases. We organized the following types of health camps:-

- Mother and Child Health Care (MCH) & Family Planning Camps.
- General Health check-up camps.
- Tuberculosis Awareness Camps.
- Dental Check-up camps.
- HIV/AIDS Awareness camps.
- Malaria/ Dengue awareness camps.

Besides all our NFE centre were provided with first aid boxes for minor cuts, burns etc. Medical treatments on emergency for children were also provided by us. PRERNA organized such camps twice in a month.



10. HIV/AIDS Awareness

HIV/AIDS is a dreadful disease which is incurable but it can be prevented. The government and various Non-Governmental Organizations are doing a lot of work, yet the disease spreading at an alarming rate with the second highest case count in the world. India has large population density, low literacy levels and consequently low levels of awareness. HIV/AIDS is one of the most challenging public health problems ever faced by the country. Through our programs we created awareness about the methods of preventing this incurable and devastating disease.

Our volunteers and counselors worked closely with truck drivers. The nomadic lifestyle and constant job insecurities of truck drivers and their helpers make them vulnerable to a series of occupational hazards and health problems. Their regular consumption of alcohol, drugs and indulgence of unprotected sex with commercial



sex workers alongwith their long distance journeys make them easy victims of these dreadful diseases. We have worked to raise HIV/AIDS awareness in two border posts where truck drivers regularly stop for completing inter-State (Badar Pur Border) Chungi, filling gas, diesel and rest & refreshments. The awareness materials were distributed through the local shops especially in the Dabhaas where the drivers

keep in touch regularly. This year on AIDS DAY, PRERNA IEC conducted 10 camps in Delhi border region and more than 4000 people attended these camps.

11. Children's Day Celebration

PRERNA celebrated Children's Day with Street, Slum and out of school children at Sanjay Park Lawn on 14th November. PRERNA team and Guest successfully brought the happiness of 300 special children during the celebration. Many activities were conducted on that particular day in which some of the activities are as followed:-



1. Greeting card making competition: With the help of this activity we brought all the children together and work in a cooperative and organized manner which also brought lots of excitement amongst them.
2. Drawing competition: With the help of drawing competition many children got the opportunity to share their views and thoughts.
3. Games with special children Vs School children: This activity helped interaction as well as generated the feeling of equality among the children without any discrimination.
4. Dance and music: Music and Dance bring people closer is a good saying, with the help of this saying we initialized and organized a small Dance and Music competition for these children which brought tons of happiness and gifts for the winners.

12. Night Shelter for Homeless

Govt. of Delhi regularly extending assistance in setting up of temporary night shelters during the month of December to March every year for the homeless people and people residing in the road side to save them from shivering cold winter season. PRERNA successfully manned three temporary Night Shelters for the Homeless people during the year 2010-2011. This was the 1st year of PRERNA joining in such project.



Our organization successfully completed the task of running the three temporary night shelters in the winter session of December-2010 to March-2011 at the following places:-

1. Nehru Place Market.
2. Chattarpur Temple.
3. Safdarjung Flyover.

Approximately 20,000 homeless were benefitted out of these temporary night shelters in winter. Within the boundaries of these shelters various activities like NFE education centre, festival celebration, Health camp, Aid awareness programs were also conducted successfully by PRERNA.

As an exemplary work, Prerna successfully convinced the parents of 50 children of homeless community residing in the temporary night shelter under Sufdarjung fly over to enroll their children in the NDMC school, Lodi Road in various classes from 1st to 7th, for the coming educational year 2011-2012 starting from June, 2011 and Prerna also took responsibility of caring educational requirements of these children of homeless community.



13. Picnic and outings for children and old age people

In order to improve the participation of the members, PRERNA conducted picnic programs. The children were taken to nearby parks and India Gate for picnic purpose. Most of the members liked to visit pilgrim places rather than an amusement park. In this year PRERNA conducted 3 visits with a total strength of 26 aged persons. The first visit was held at Lotus Temple, second visit was to Akshar Dhama Temple and 3rd and the final trip was organized to Kalkaji Temple.

14. Activity on Environmental issue

PRERNA actively took part in the 'Delhi Clean Drive' which was initiated by 'Art of Living' as a part of preparedness for the forthcoming 'Commonwealth Games-2010' conducted by India.
